 <h1>bore</h1>	<p>to make a hole in with an instrument such as a drill</p> <p><i>Mom bore a hole in the back of the birdhouse so that we could hang it up on the peg outside our window.</i></p> 
 <h1>bore</h1>	<p>to make (a hole) through or in with a drill or similar tool</p> <p><i>He bored two holes in the wood for the two screws to go into.</i></p> 
 <h1>bore</h1>	<p>to create (an opening such as a tunnel) by cutting through</p> <p><i>They bored a big tunnel between the UK and France, so that trains could transport passengers between the two countries.</i></p>

 <h1>bore</h1>	<p>a person whose talk or behavior is dull and uninteresting</p> <p><i>The reporter on TV bores us with his talk about the stock market.</i></p> 
 <h1>bore</h1>	<p>tidal water that rises abruptly to form a wave as it moves inland</p> <p><i>Bores occur in relatively few locations worldwide, usually in areas with a large tidal range.</i></p>

brush



a continuous act or single motion of using a brush

Look at the good brush strokes in that painting.



brush



a brief, light touch or quick encounter

She brushed her daughter's cheek with her hand.



brush



push (something) away with a quick movement of the hand

She brushed a wisp of hair away from her face.

fence

fork



a tool with a handle and two or more points. Small forks are used for eating. Large forks are used for digging and pitching hay.

Dad mashed the potatoes with a large fork.

 <h1>log</h1>	<p>a daily record of a trip by a ship or plane. A log keeps records of speed, distance traveled, and any important events</p> <p><i>There's a complete record of the storm in the ship's log.</i></p> 
 <h1>log</h1>	<p>to cut down the trees from</p> <p><i>In Canada, there are many areas where it is illegal to log trees.</i></p>

a deep hole or area of holes made in the earth. Minerals such as gold, coal, or precious stones are dug out of mines.

<h1>mold</h1> 	<p>to influence the growth or character of</p> <p><i>Education helps to mold character.</i></p> 
<h1>mold</h1> 	<p>a fungus that grows on the surface of plant or animal materials such as food or leather. Some kinds of mold are fuzzy or fluffy</p> <p><i>There's mold on the bread.</i></p>

 <h1>paste</h1>	<p>to cause to stick by means of paste</p> <p><i>I stuck two sheets of paper together with paste.</i></p> 
 <h1>paste</h1>	<p>to cover with some material that has paste on it</p> <p><i>He pasted the notice on the door.</i></p>

<h1>plain</h1> 	<p>easily seen or heard; clear; visible</p> <p><i>The house is in plain sight.</i></p> 
<h1>plain</h1> 	<p>clear and understood; obvious</p> <p><i>She made it plain that she wanted to go to college.</i></p>
