

Possessive Nouns – Using apostrophe + 's'

Grade 1 Nouns Worksheet

Put an apostrophe + 's' after the noun.

To indicate possession, put an apostrophe + 's' after the noun:
The skates belong to Mark;
they are Mark's skates.

1. The hat belongs to Nick. It is Nick hat.
2. The coat belongs to dad. It is dad coat.
3. The scarf belongs to Ms. Brown. It is Ms. Brown scarf.
4. The boots belong to Lynn. They are Lynn boots.
5. The skipping rope belongs to Matt. It is Matt skipping rope.
6. The mitts belong to Felicia. They are Felicia mitts.
7. The belt belongs to grandpa. It is grandpa belt.
8. The earmuffs belong to Sophie. They are Sophie earmuffs.
9. The bag belongs to Brandon. It is Brandon bag.
10. The lunch box belongs to Tenley. It is Tenley lunch box.

Answers

- 1. The hat belongs to Nick. It is Nick _'s_ hat.
- 2. The coat belongs to dad. It is dad <u>'s</u> coat.

- 4. The boots belong to Lynn. They are Lynn _'s boots.
- 5. The skipping rope belongs to Matt. It is Matt <u>'s</u> skipping rope.
