

Addition of three or more numbers

Grade 1 Word Problems Worksheet

Today is the day for the field trip to the zoo. Every student is very excited!

- 1. There are 21 first graders and 6 second graders in the first bus. In the second bus, there are 14 first graders and 12 second graders. In the third bus, there are 8 first graders and 15 second graders. How many first graders are there? How many second graders are there?
- 2. The zoo is separated into 4 zones. The Artic zone has 5 exhibits. The African zone has 11 exhibits. The rainforest zone has 8 exhibits and the tropical zone has 13 exhibits. How many exhibits are there in the zoo?
- 3. In the exhibit for the zebras, there are 17 zebras outside. In the sheltered area, there are 6 female zebras with 5 baby zebras.

 How many zebras are there in total?



4. At the ostrich exhibit, 6 eggs are laid and will be brought to the nursery. In the first nursery, there are 28 eggs waiting to be hatched. In the second nursery, there are 9 eggs. How many ostrich eggs are there in total?

5. The lion exhibit has 18 female lions and 5 male lions. 6 baby lions were born last month. 3 of the babies are male and 3 of them are female. How many lions are there in the zoo?

6. Write the addition sentence that fits this: "In the morning, 17 tons of fish is fed to the sharks. In the afternoon, another 13 tons of fish is fed. Before the zoo is closed, another 18 tons of fish is fed to the sharks. The sharks are fed with 48 tons of fish everyday."



Answers

1. 21 + 14 + 8 = 43There are 43 first graders.

$$6 + 12 + 15 = 33$$

There are 33 second graders.

- 2. 5 + 11 + 8 + 13 = 37There are 37 exhibits.
- 3. 17 + 6 + 5 = 28There are 28 zebras in total.
- 4. 6 + 28 + 9 = 43There are 43 ostrich eggs.
- 5. 18 + 5 + 6 = 29There are 29 lions in the zoo.
- 6. 17 + 13 + 18 = 48
