A **sequence** is what happens *first*, *next*, and *last*.

Here are some examples. Write the number 1 in the box beside what happened *first*. Write the number 2 in the box beside what happens *next*. Write the number 3 in the box beside what happens *last*.

1. What happened first, next, and last?	1, 2, or 3?
Lisa tried on three pairs of shoes.	
Lisa's Mom took her to the shoe store.	
Lisa liked her new shoes.	



2. What happened <i>first</i> , <i>next</i> , and <i>last</i> ?	1, 2, or 3?
Bob's dad took him fishing.	
Bob's family had fish for dinner.	
Bob caught two fish.	

3. Draw 3 pictures to show the **sequence** of Bob's day. What happened *first*, *next*, and *last*?
